FAQ

Stomach cancer

Q Isn't the recommended age 40 years or older?	A In 2016, the national guideline was changed and it is now recommended to have a screening every two years at the age of 50 or older.
Q Are there any checkups that do not include stomach X-ray or gastroscopy?	A The standard checkup <small>course</small> does not include "stomach X-ray, gastroscopy," "blood sampling for detailed tests," etc. Differences in Health Checkup Courses (Employees) >>>
Q Can the ABC checkup be a substitute for a stomach cancer screening?	A The ABC checkup investigates the possibility of developing stomach cancer and is not a substitute for a stomach cancer screening. However, the results of the ABC checkup will indicate your risk level, allowing you to schedule regular gastroscopy screenings accordingly. Understanding the ABC Checkup >>>



Breast cancer

Q I don't want to undergo mammography because it hurts.	A Breasts swell before menstruation and become sensitive. If it's painful for you, please try to undergo mammography after your period. We recommend mammography for those who are 40 years or older.

Cervical cancer

Q My period started. Can I cancel the test?	A Please call the medical facility directly and check if you can reschedule your pap smear test.
Q I'm concerned about uterine cancer.	A Please perform the self-check described in "Women's Health" on the website on the right . If you have symptoms, please call the medical facility before your checkup or consult with your doctor during the checkup.

Others

Q Does the government recommend all cancer screenings?	A The government recommends only five types of cancer screenings (lung, stomach, colon, cervical and breast cancer) for group health checkups (e.g. workplace checkups). The reason is that there are screening methods that can detect cancer early, and it has been scientifically proven that treatment can reduce the mortality rate.
Q I am also concerned about cancers other than the five mentioned above. I am not within the eligible age, but I am concerned because I have a family history.	A The cancer risk is different for each individual depending on their family history and other factors. If you wish to have more screening tests other than those mentioned above, you can add them at your own expense. Please contact the medical facility where you booked your appointment.
Q What is the differences between the standard checkup <small>course</small> and the advanced checkup <small>course</small> ?	A Please see " Differences in Health Checkup Courses (Employees) " on the right.
Q I received the cancer screening notice from my municipality. Which one should I choose?	A Please choose either one of the municipality screening or the FR Group health checkup.
